



At A Glance: Roadmap for OAE Hearing Screening, Referral, and Follow-Up Ages 0-5

Step 1: Screening: Screening with an OAE is appropriate for children birth-5.

Primary Care Providers (PCPs) Provide risk assessment for hearing loss	Early Childhood Providers (ECPs) (Teachers, Directors)	Horizons Public Health Nurse Consultant (following KidsHearing.org guidelines)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Well child visits • Suspected hearing problems • Family request • Per practice guidelines • May refer to Horizons for OAE screening for ages birth-5 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Annual hearing screenings coordinated by Grand Beginnings for every licensed early childhood program • Report screening results to family • Collect consent forms 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Utilizing OAE trained staff to perform OAE screening on children in licensed early childhood programs annually • Perform OAE screening on children birth-5 referred by PCPs

Step 2: Referral

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Review results with family. • Explain to parent the importance of sharing information with the child's PCP/ECP. • Explain to parent that a hearing screening is not a full hearing exam.
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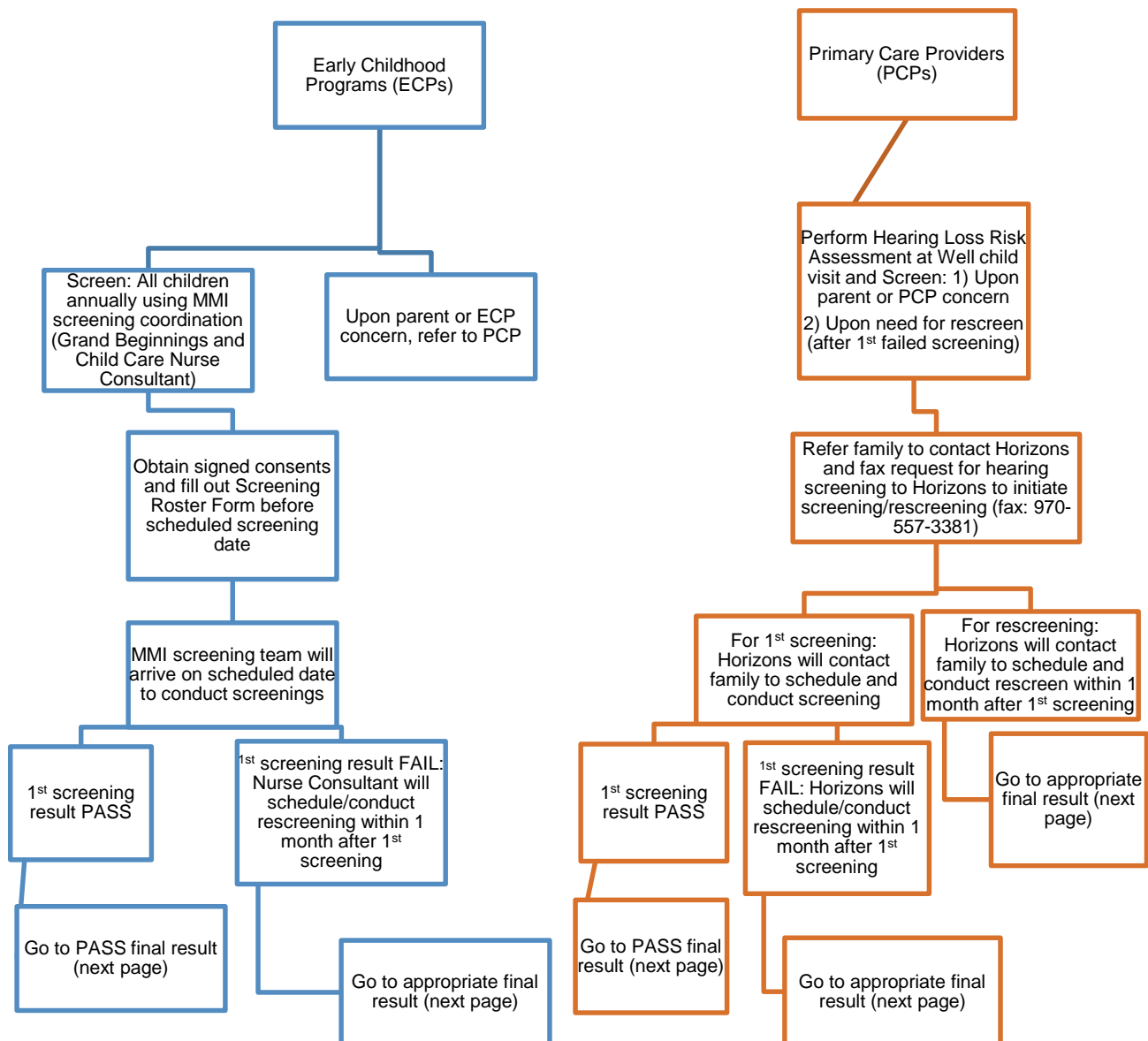
Step 3: Follow-Up

<u>Pass</u>	<u>Refer</u>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue annual hearing screenings. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Re-screen within one month. • If 2nd screening is a "refer": Director will contact the family and refer to PCP. • If PCP determines a medical reason for concern, treat accordingly. PCP can contact Horizons (fax: 970-557-3381) for re-screen following medical treatment. • If PCP determines that audiological evaluation is needed, referral will be made by PCP. Common audiology resources: Rocky Mountain Pediatric ENT (phone: 303-301-9019), Children's Hospital Audiology (phone: 720-777-6800), and UHealth Audiology (phone: 720-848-2800). • Determine barriers to obtaining an evaluation (cost, transportation). Utilize Rural Health Network Patient Navigator program if appropriate (phone: 970-725-3477).



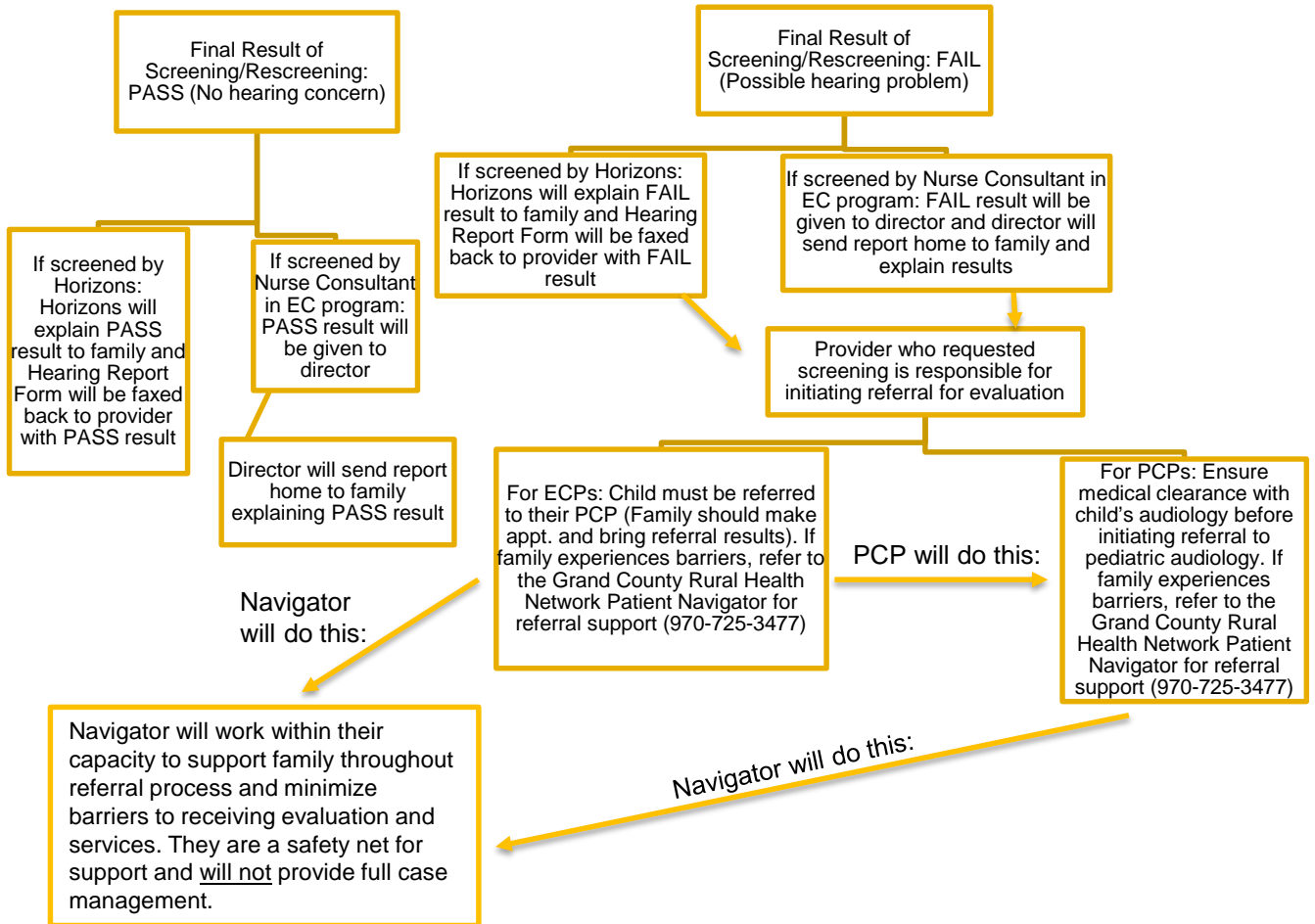

Follow-Up for Failed Screening Results
